Application Checklist

- 1. Completed Application form.
- 2. Nonrefundable application fee of US\$65/HK\$500, payable to China Education (EE) Ltd.
- 3. Official transcript of applicant's high school/secondary school academic record. If the transcript does not include the most recently completed term, the applicant or school should also submit a copy of the most recent report card.
- 4 Proof of English Proficiency

Students applying for admission to The Berkeley Summer Select Program are required to meet the English Proficiency Requirement (EPR). All applicants from countries are required to submit official evidence of English language proficiency score such as TOEFL and IELTS. Waiver could be granted to students who have attended schools at the secondary level (high school) or above for at least three years full-time where English is the principal language of instruction as in some international schools.

- 5. Personal statement (250-500 words) describing academic preparation, personal interests, and motivation for participating in an intensive academic program.
- 6. Two letters of recommendation.

All students may submit a letter written by a guidance counselor, principal, or headmaster commenting on the student's intellectual ability, English proficiency, level of maturity, and motivation for participating in the Berkeley-CEG Summer Select Program.

Behavioral Standards Consent Form

The University expects that students will act in a sensitive and considerate manner at all times and respect the rights of others. While every subtlety of proper behavior cannot be detailed, the following rules are to be adhered to strictly. Failure to abide by them is dealt with immediately and leads to expulsion from the Berkeley Summer Select Program. No portion of fees or tuition will be refunded to an expelled student. Expelled students do not receive transcript, evaluation letters or Statements of Attendance.

Behavioral Standards

- 1. The possession and/or use of drugs and/or alcohol, on campus or off, is forbidden. Possession of weapons or incendiary devices of any kind is prohibited. Contraband is confiscated upon discovery; expulsion follows immediately.
- 2. UC Berkeley deems unacceptable any verbal or physical conduct that demeans others because of their race, gender, ethnic background, religion, or sexual orientation.
- 3. Students must attend class unless they are ill.
- 4. Plagiarism is not tolerated. Plagiarism includes, but is not limited to, submitting work done by another person or submitted by another source; failing to document ideas found in sources, whether print or electronic, with appropriate notes and bibliographic references; failing to enclose borrowed phrases or sentences within quotation marks; and turning in an assignment for two courses without advance permission from both instructors.
- 5. Students must be in their assigned suites or at the residence by 11 p.m. and remain there throughout the night. Students who are delayed in returning to campus must contact a resident adviser by phone; delays should be born of unexpected circumstances, such as a problem with transportation beyond a student's control.
- 6. Residential students who need to leave campus overnight or on weekends must request a note from their parents requesting such privileges. A note is required for each instance, detailing date and time of departure, destination, and expected time of return. Notes must be presented 24 hours in advance of departure. Only notes mailed, faxed, or presented in person by a parent are accepted.
- 7. Sitting on window ledges or roofs and dropping or throwing objects out of windows are forbidden.

8.	Only students and resident advisers are permitted in the dormitory. Visitors to the dormitory are not permitted either during the day or at night. This includes parents, other family members, and classmates who are not in the residential program.
